

**Summers County Board of Education**

**1. Roll Call**

**2. Invocation/Pledge of Allegiance**

**4. Expulsion Hearing**

Mrs. Hinerman recommended that one Summers County High School male student #810004181 be expelled for the remainder of the 2010-2011 school year, for a violation of 18A-5-1a, the School Laws of West Virginia, the Summers County Safe and Orderly Schools Student Conduct Policy, and the State Code of Conduct. During this expulsion, this student may be provided homebound services and/or attend alternatives classes. Parents are required to provide transportation for attending alternative classes. This student is not permitted to be on school property unless authorized by the principal.

Dr. Clark made a motion to approve the superintendent's recommendation. Mr. Withrow seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
