

**Summers County Board of Education**  
**SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES**  
**October 3, 2012**  
**10:00 a.m.**

**1. Roll Call**

The Summers County Board of Education met in a special meeting on October 3, 2012, 10:00 a.m. in the board office conference room with Ms. Sue Angell, board president, presiding over the meeting with the following board members present: Mr. David Ballard, Dr. Deborah Clark, Mrs. Jean Gore, and Mr. James Withrow.

Other staff members present: Mrs. Vicki Hinerman, *Superintendent*; Dr. Sarah Brown, *Director of Curriculum*; Mr. David Quisenberry, *Director of Attendance*; and Mrs. Jennifer Farley, *Business Manager*

**2. Invocation/Pledge of Allegiance**

The invocation was given by Mr. Ballard and followed by the "Pledge of Allegiance."

**3. Approval of Agenda**

Upon a motion by Mr. Ballard seconded by Mrs. Gore and by unanimous vote, the agenda was approved.

**4. Expulsion Hearings**

The student requested an open hearing.

Mr. Houchins presented the facts concerning this case and recommended that student ID #810005419 be expelled for a 365 day period for a violation of 18A-5-1a.

Following the hearing, Mr. Ballard made a motion to go into executive session for the purpose of deliberation, pursuant to 6-9A-4 (3). Mr. Withrow seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Upon returning to the public session, Mrs. Hinerman recommended that one Summers County High School male student ID#810005419 be expelled for a 365 day period for a violation of *18A-5-1a, the School Laws of West Virginia* and the *Summers County Safe and Orderly Schools Student Conduct Policy*. During this expulsion, this student may attend alternative classes. Parents are required to provide transportation. This student is not permitted to be on school property unless authorized by the principal.

Upon a motion by Dr. Clark, seconded by Mr. Ballard and by unanimous vote, the meeting was adjourned.
