

**Summers County Board of Education
SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES**

March 22, 2013

9:00 a.m.

1. Roll Call

▶The Summers County Board of Education met in a special meeting on March 22, 2013, 9:00 a.m. in the board office conference room with Ms. Sue Angell, Board President, presiding over the meeting with the following board members present: Mr. David Ballard, Dr. Deborah Clark, Mrs. Jean Gore, and Mr. James Withrow.

2. Invocation/Pledge of Allegiance

▶The invocation was given by Mr. Ballard and followed by the "Pledge of Allegiance."

3. Approval of Agenda

▶Upon a motion made by Mr. Ballard seconded by Mrs. Gore and by unanimous vote, the agenda was approved.

4. Expulsion Hearing

The family requested a closed hearing.

Mrs. Hinerman requested board go into executive session for the purpose of an expulsion hearing, pursuant to 6-9A-4.

Dr. Clark made a motion to go into executive session. Mr. Withrow seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Upon returning to the public session, Mr. Duman recommended that the student ID#810005850 be expelled for a 365 day period for a violation of 18A-5-1a, with placement in homebound.

Mrs. Hinerman recommended that one Summers Middle School male student ID#810005850 be expelled for 365 days a violation of *18A-5-1a, the School Laws of West Virginia and the Summers County Policy VII-A-10, Expected Behavior in Safe and Supportive Schools*. During this expulsion, this student may receive homebound services. This student is not permitted to be on school property unless authorized by the principal.

Mr. Ballard made a motion to approve the superintendent's recommendation, Mr. Withrow seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
